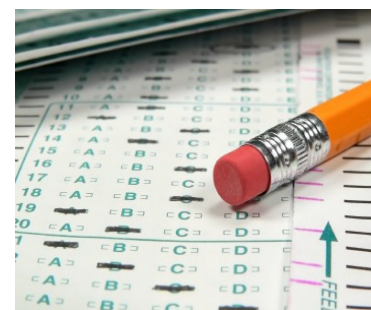
October also brings us two important testing events. First, the PSAT will be offered to students on October 10, 2018. This is the practice test to prepare and familiarize the student with the test format and content

for the actual SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test). The SAT is one of the exams required by most colleges and universities.

All 8th grade students will take the IOWA Assessments standardized test October 22, 2018-November 2, 2018. This test measures a student's knowledge in reading, language arts, math, science, and social studies. During this testing period please make sure your child gets a good night's rest and arrives to school on time each day. If you have any questions or concerns regarding these
