# **OPTION A\*:**

### **TWO 3-CREDIT PDE3 COURSES**

(UP TO 30 PARTICIPANTS)

## Course # 1: Making Instruction Effective for English Language Learners

 This course is designed to allow teachers of ELs to develop and strengthen the skills, instincts, abilities, processes and resources that EL teachers need to survive, adapt, and thrive in a culturally and linguistically diverse classroom. It is critical all ELs educators complete this prerequisite to effectively gain understanding of knowledge, skills and disposition competencies for ELs.

# Course # 2: Engaging Students in Quality Instruction Aligned to Academic and Language Standards

This course is designed to provide teachers
the understanding to why there is an essential
need of equity of access and opportunity for
multilingual learners' preparation for college,
career, and civic participation. As part of this
course, participants will have opportunities to
design lessons lessons that integrate both the
language and content standards and intentionally
plan for collaboration with stakeholders to best
support the multilingual learner.
